OVERLEAF NOTES

POINTS TO NOTE WHEN COMPLETING FORMS FOR CERTIFICATES OF ORIGIN

1. Photostating or copying of this form is not permitted.
2. The certificate must be signed by an authorised person of the company or firm who must ensure that the details are correct. Invoices and other relevant documents should be attached.
3. It is recommended that the entries be typewritten. No erasures or superimposition are allowed and alterations should be made by striking out the erroneous material and making the required alterations. Such alterations should be approved by the person who authorised the alteration.
4. Any unused space should be crossed out to prevent any subsequent addition.
5. If the exporter / shipper is not a manufacturer, a certificate from the manufacturer to the effect that the goods in question were in fact manufactured by him should be produced.
6. Commercial invoices for endorsement must be signed by an authorised employee of the company who is identifiable by name and designation and who has knowledge of the transaction.
7. Re-exports must be supported by the approved import declaration(s) and original invoice(s) from the supplier or the bill of lading to establish origin.
8. Inclusion of the relevant customs tariff classification number in this document will assist clearance of the goods in the importing country.
9. Field 10 must be completed by the exporter declaring all the details and statements provided are true and goods declared are in accordance to the Rules of Origin stipulated below:
 - a) Manufactured in Malaysia and used 100% local materials; or
 - b) Manufactured in Malaysia through transformation process which alters tariff code classification at six (6) digit level ; or
 - c) Contains at least 25% local materials.
10. Goods which do not comply with the above origin requirements shall be considered as goods not originating from Malaysia. Therefore, the name of the country where the goods were originally produced or processed must be stated in Field 10, (country) column.

NOTE : Refusal by foreign customs to accept certificates of origin due to discrepancies in them can result in delays in clearing the goods.
